

2021 INSTRUMENTAL MUSIC SCHOLARSHIP

The Music Department is offering four \$700 scholarships for group music lessons in 2021. These scholarships offer an incentive to our music students to further their instrumental studies and continue their involvement in the music community at Brighton Secondary College. Scholarships are available on the following instruments:

Brass: French Horn, Trombone, Trumpet

Woodwind: Saxophone, Clarinet, Flute

Strings: Violin, Viola, Cello, Double Bass

Contemporary: Voice, Drums/Percussion, Guitar, Bass Guitar

Applications will be assessed and shortlisted for an audition process, which will take place mid-December. Students invited for an audition must perform one piece which best demonstrates their ability. The piece can be performed solo or with an accompaniment (live or backing track). The closing date for applications is Friday December 4 2020.

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INSTRUMENT HIRE POLICY 2021

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PURPOSE

The purpose of this policy is to explain to our school community the terms of Intrument hire for students.

POLICY

The College has a limited selection of string, brass and woodwind instruments available for hire if necessary. Instrument hire can be arranged with the Director of Music once the student has an instrument confirmed and is enrolled in lessons. The cost of instrument hire is **\$300 per instrument, per year**. Payment is expected by **31 March 2021.**

Under normal circumstances our hire instruments are reserved for Year 7 students who are learning a new instrument. Parents of students who have been learning for a year or more are encouraged to purchase an instrument for their child. In some circumstances we can arrange instrument hire for students in Year 8 and above. This will be arranged with the Director of Music on a case by case basis.

The College does not currently offer insurance for hire instruments. By agreeing to this policy, you assume all responsibility for the cost of repairs or replacement as a result of damage or theft. The College recommends that you take out your own insurance policy for the duration of the hire period.

PURPOSE

The purpose of this policy is to explain to our school community the optional Music program for students.

POLICY

Instrumental Music is an optional program for students. If you wish for your child to be enrolled in this program you need to read and accept this agreement. The cost of group lessons is **\$700 per year.** The cost of individual lessons is **\$1500 per year.** Payment is expected by **28 January 2021.**

The College has a limited selection of string, brass and woodwind instruments available for hire. Hire instruments are normally reserved for Year 7 students and can be arranged with the Director of Music once the student is enrolled in an instrument. Instrument hire is **\$300 per instrument, per year**. Payment is expected by **31 March 2021.**

Lessons are conducted once per week with a qualified instrumental music teacher and will begin during February. Lessons are timetabled on a rotating roster so students do not miss the same scheduled classroom subject each week. Teachers are employed based on student numbers and the expectation is that students will attend lessons for the full year. Please note that any withdrawal requests will not automatically attract a refund.

In addition to their lessons, all instrumental students are required to join at least one ensemble. Once enrolled, students will be allocated to an ensemble. Ensembles rehearse weekly **before or after school** and attendance is compulsory.

Our ensembles include Year 7 Primo Band, Show Band, String Ensemble, Junior Guitar Ensemble, Next Level Ensemble, World Band and Vocal Ensemble.

The College will endeavour to deliver 12 instrumental lessons per semester. Students may receive more or less than 12 lessons per semester depending on College activities such as camps, sporting events, semester exams and excursions. Make-up lessons will only be scheduled if a student has an approved absence from school. Students who cannot attend their scheduled lesson **must email** their teacher as early as possible regarding the reason for absence. Where appropriate, the teacher will organise a make-up lessons. Please understand that make-up lessons may not always be possible depending on the time of year or the teacher's availability.

If students are unable to attend due to illness, a medical certificate is required to be eligible for a makeup lesson. Non-approved school absences include: family holidays, illness without medical certificate, non-attendance through student choice, that is, the student was at school, but did not attend the music lesson.

Lessons are typically conducted in small groups of between 2 and 4 students. We also offer the option of individual lessons, if preferable. Students are responsible for checking their lesson times on Compass and arriving promptly with all required materials.

Students must bring the appropriate equipment to every lesson. This may include: instrument, music books, music folder, cleaning equipment, drum sticks and USB. Students who arrive without these

essential items may be sent back to class at the discretion of the music teacher. Guitar, Bass, Double Bass and Drums/Percussion students do not need to bring their instruments to lessons.

Due to high demand for certain instruments we advise you to list three genuine instrument preferences to avoid disappointment. We cannot guarantee students will receive their first preference so please consider your second and third instrument preferences carefully.

Instrumental Music is an essential compulsory component of the Year 7 SEAL program. To ensure your child is enrolled in this program payment is expected by **28 January 2021**. The cost of group lessons is **\$700 per year**. The cost of individual lessons is **\$1500 per year**.

The College has a limited selection of string, brass and woodwind instruments available for hire. Instrument hire can be arranged with the Director of Music once the is enrolled in an instrument. Instrument hire is **\$300 per instrument, per year**. Payment is expected by **31 March 2021.**

Lessons are conducted once per week with a qualified instrumental music teacher and will begin during February.
