Schools provide students with free instruction to fulfil the 'standard' Victorian curriculum and we want to assure you that all contributions are voluntary. Nevertheless, the ongoing support of our families ensures that Brighton Secondary College can deliver programs and experiences beyond the 'standard curriculum' to ensure the best possible education and support for our students. We want to thank you for your contributions in 2024.

In 2025 BSC is asking for contributions of approximately \$425 per term / \$1700 per year (on average as course selections vary). This amount **includes** extra-curricular or 'Optional activities' such as school incursions, excursions and initiatives such as last weeks 'Activities Week.

This amount **excludes** the cost of year level camps, Outdoor Education camps and other optional interstate and overseas tours.

- In 4 equal Instalments (on the first day of each term in 2025)

You will receive a notification in your Compass news feed with instructions when Parent Payment arrangements (known as 'Course Confirmations' in Compass) are published and ready for your attention.

As detailed above, please contact the school office should you require an alternative method of making payment or would like to set up individual payment arrangements.

Refunds

Parent requests for refunds are subject to the discretion of the school and made on a case-by-case basis. Refunds will be provided where the school deems it is reasonable and fair to do so, taking into consideration whether a cost has been incurred, the Department's Parent Payment Policy and Guidance, Financial Help for Families Policy and any other relevant information.

FREE INSTRUCTION

- Schools provide students with free instruction and ensure students have free access to all items, activities and services that are used by the school to fulfil the standard curriculum requirements in Victorian Curriculum F-10, VCE and VCAL.
- Schools may invite parents to make a financial contribution to support the school.

PARENT PAYMENT REQUESTS

Schools can request contributions from parents under three categories:



Curriculum Contributions

Voluntary financial contributions for curriculum items and activities which the school deems necessary for students to learn the Curriculum.

Other Contributions

Voluntary financial contributions for non-curriculum items and activities that relate to the school's functions and objectives.

Extra-Curricular Items and Activities

Items and activities that enhance or broaden the schooling experience of students and are above and beyond what the school provides for free to deliver the Curriculum.

These are provided on a user-pays basis.



- Schools put in place financial hardship arrangements to support families who cannot pay for items or activities so that their child doesn't miss out.
- Schools have a nominated parent payment contact person(s) that parents can have a confidential discussion with regarding financial hardship arrangements.



SCHOOL PROCESSES

 Schools must obtain school council approval for their parent payment arrangements and publish all requests and communications for each year level on their school website for transparency.
